Program goal

The M.F.A. in Theatre offers concentrations in stage design/technical theatre and costume design, which comprise the professional option, and in literature and performance, which make up the pedagogy option. Focus areas in pedagogy include movement, performance, and voice and speech.

Student learning outcomes

- Students will demonstrate knowledge of history, theory, criticism and literature of theatre and its practical application.
- Students will be able to teach or engage in the practical application of theater in performance and production.
- Students will demonstrate an understanding of what is required to teach an undergraduate course in theatre studies and/or to produce effective designs for production.

Degree candidacy requirements

A graduate student admitted to a program or concentration requiring a final research project, work of art, thesis or dissertation, must qualify for continuing master's or doctoral status according to the degree candidacy requirements of the student's graduate program. Admission to degree candidacy, if applicable, is a formal statement by the graduate student's faculty regarding the student's academic achievements and the student's readiness to proceed to the final research phase of the degree program.

In addition to the general admission requirements of the VCU Graduate School (<https://bulletin.vcu.edu/graduate/study/admission-graduate-study/admission-requirements/>), applicants must possess a bachelor's degree (theatre preferred). Professional experience will be considered. The program provides preparation for early to mid-career professionals to enter the field of teaching theatre at the college/university level.

Degree requirements

In addition to general Graduate School graduation requirements (<https://bulletin.vcu.edu/academic-regs/grad/graduation-info/>), students are required to take 60 credit hours of graduate-level course work distributed among core courses, area of concentration and electives, including special topics courses. Students will also be evaluated on performance projects, production work and teaching activities. The program is usually completed within two years.

Pedagogy/performance concentration

Requirements of the pedagogy/performance concentration include 30 credit hours in core courses (including theatre history, research practice and theory, literature and production), 12 credit hours in the performance concentration and 6 credit hours of thesis/thesis project. The remainder of the program consists of 12 approved elective courses. Students will take practical courses and assist faculty in teaching. Their teaching effectiveness will be evaluated by area faculty.
