PUBLIC MANAGEMENT, CERTIFICATE IN (POST-BACCALAUREATE GRADUATE CERTIFICATE)

Program goal

The graduate certificate in public management is a program designed to enable practitioners in government and nonprofit organizations to acquire knowledge and skills in public administration without pursuing a full master's degree. This program is delivered online, face-to-face or hybrid.

Student learning outcomes

- 1. Students will participate in and contribute to the policy process.
- 2. Students will lead and manage in public governance.
- 3. Students will articulate and apply a public service perspective.

In addition to the general admission requirements of the VCU Graduate School (https://bulletin.vcu.edu/graduate/study/admission-graduatestudy/admission-requirements/), admission to the certificate program requires the same application procedure used for the M.P.A., with the exception of the standardized examination, which is not required. Further, the standardized exam requirement for the M.P.A. program is waived for certificate students who have a minimum GPA of 3.5 after completion of at least six credits of certificate course work.

Degree requirements

In addition to general VCU Graduate School graduation requirements (https://bulletin.vcu.edu/academic-regs/grad/graduation-info/), the certificate requires a total of 18 hours of graduate credit hours involving a mix of required and elective courses. The courses are the same as those offered to M.P.A. students.
